## Delivery of SHARE

- State clear purpose of session.
- Children work in mixed ability groups.
- Wide range of activities e.g. concept map, discussion groups, drama, practical activities, questions & answers.
- Clarify misconceptions.
- Encourage children's ownership of the programme.
